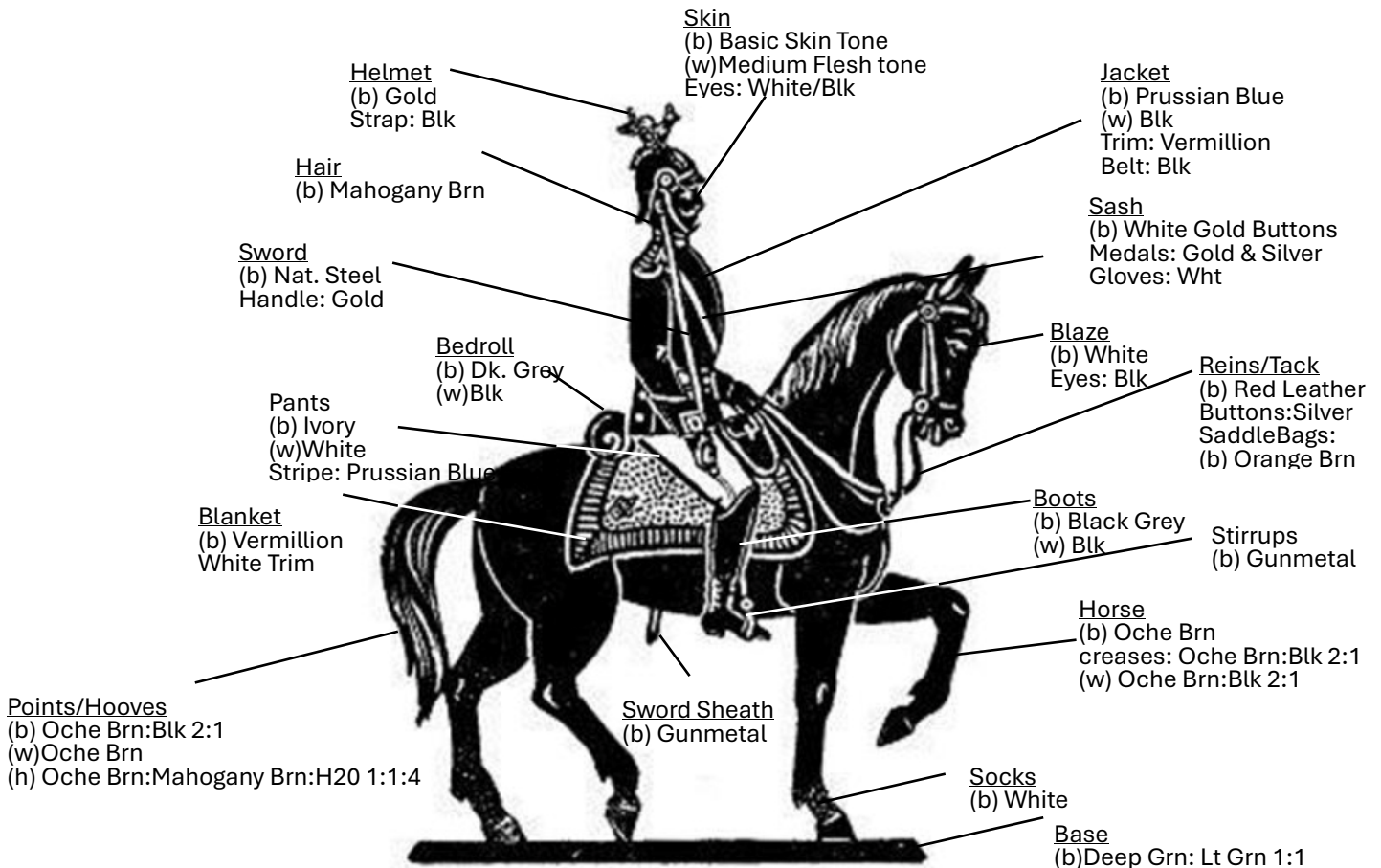


# Vintage Toy Soldier Paint Scheme for Prussian Officer

Below are the colors, as suggested by The Old Man, to paint the Prussian Officer from the 1930's Gebr. Schneider Bros. mould No.13. The suggested paints are from Vallejo Paints. Remember though, feel free to substitute the colors you have for similar colors here!

White - 70.951	Prussian Blue - 70.965	Light Green - 70.942
Ivory - 70.918	Black - 70.861	Deep Green - 70.980
Basic Skin Tone - 70.815	Dark Grey - 70.994	Ochre Brown - 70.856
Medium Flesh Tone - 70.860	Gold - 70.996	Red leather - 70.818
Vermillion - 70.909	Silver - 70.997	Black Grey - 70.862
Mahogany Brown - 70.846	Gunmetal Grey - 70.863	Grey Primer - 70.601
Natural Steel - 70.864	Orange Brown - 70.981	

You can use the brush on primer if the model is not already primed when you receive it. I STRONGLY encourage you to varnish your model when you are done painting it. The paint will last considerably longer and stay a bit more color true (in my opinion) if you do. I really like the Polyurethane Varnish (gloss is 26.650) from Vallejo over their other offerings in the model paint range.
