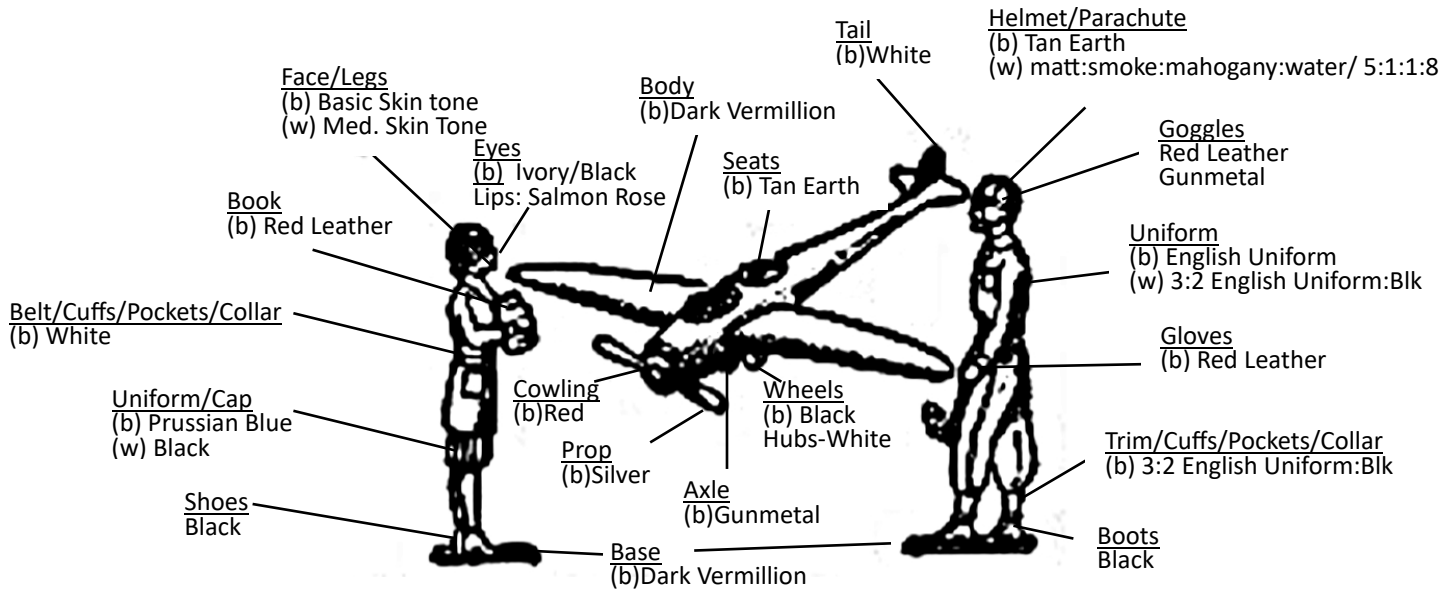


Vintage Toy Soldier Paint Scheme for The Sky Pilot

Below are the colors suggested, by The Old Man, to paint the Pilot, Stewardess, and Plane of “The Sky Pilot” from the 1930’s Home Foundry Mould A3 as found in their 1935 catalog but was also listed as C-23 on the box. The suggested paints are from Vallejo Paints.



White – 70.951	Red – 70.926	Red Leather – 70.818
Yellow Ochre – 70.913	Tan earth – 70.874	Salmon Rose – 70.835
Smoke Ink – 70.939	Mahogany Ink – 70.828	Silver – 70.997
Ivory – 70.918	Basic Skin Tone – 70.815	English Uniform – 70.921
Prussian Blue – 70.965	Medium Flesh Tone – 70.860	Gunmetal Grey – 70.863
Black – 70.861	Dark Vermillion – 70.947	Matt Medium – 70.540

You can use the brush on primer (70.601) if the model is not already primed it. I STRONGLY encourage you to varnish your model when you are done painting it. The paint will last considerably longer and stay a bit more color true (in my opinion) if you do. I really like the Polyurethane Varnish (gloss is 26.650) from Vallejo over their other offerings in the model paint range.

Hair Color Pro Tip: Base her hair white, then use Yellow Ochre and water in a 1:4 wash, followed by a smoke and water wash of 1:6. Finally highlight the hair tips with a Ivory and Yellow Ochre juice at 1:1:3 with water.

Parachute Color Pro Tip: base paint the parachute with Tan Earth then wash with Matt:Smoke:Wood:Water in a 5:1:1:8 ratio

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
