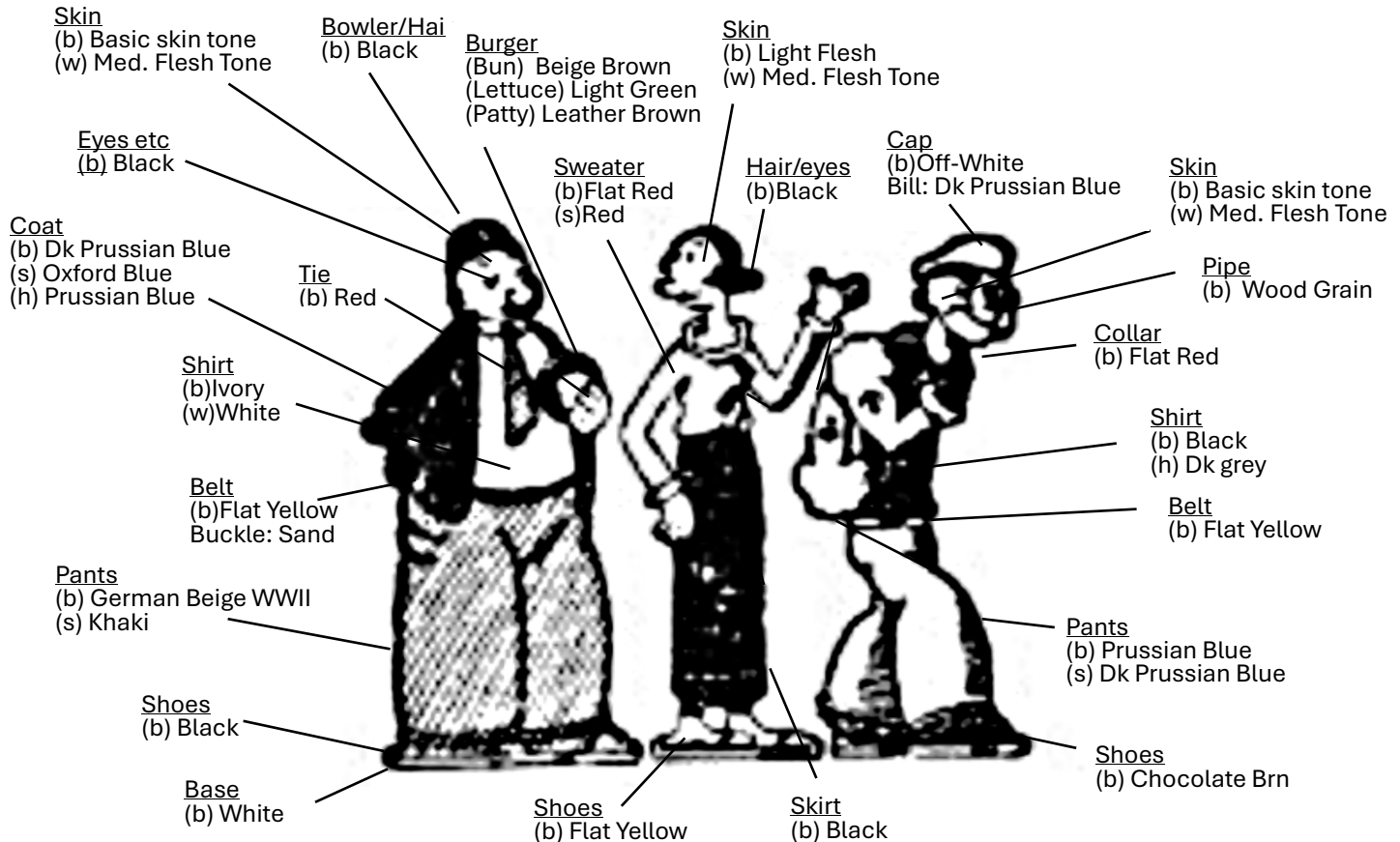


VintageToySoldier.com Paint Scheme for Popeye The Sailor

Below are the colors suggested, by The Old Man, to paint Popeye, Olive Oyl and J. Wellington Wimpy of “Popeye The Sailor” from the 1930’s Home Foundry Mould C52 as found in their 1937 catalog. The suggested paints are from Vallejo Paints.

Light Flesh – 70.928	Khaki – 70.988	Chocolate Brown – 70.872
Basic Skin Tone – 70.815	German Beige WWII – 70.821	Beige Brown – 70.875
Medium Flesh Tone – 70.860	Red – 70.926	Leather Brown – 70.871
Black – 70.861	Flat Red – 70.957	Dark Grey – 70.994

You can use the brush on primer (70.601) if the model is not already primed it. I STRONGLY encourage you to varnish your model when you are done painting it. The paint will last considerably longer and stay a bit more color true (in my opinion) if you do. I really like the Polyurethane Varnish (gloss is 26.650) from Vallejo over their other offerings in the model paint range.

Paint Option: If you like you could paint the collar and cuffs on Olive Oyl White to really set off the sweater. As Always, the paint suggestions above are just that. Feel free to modify however you like and if you are happy with your painting and want me to add it to the gallery send me a photo!

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
