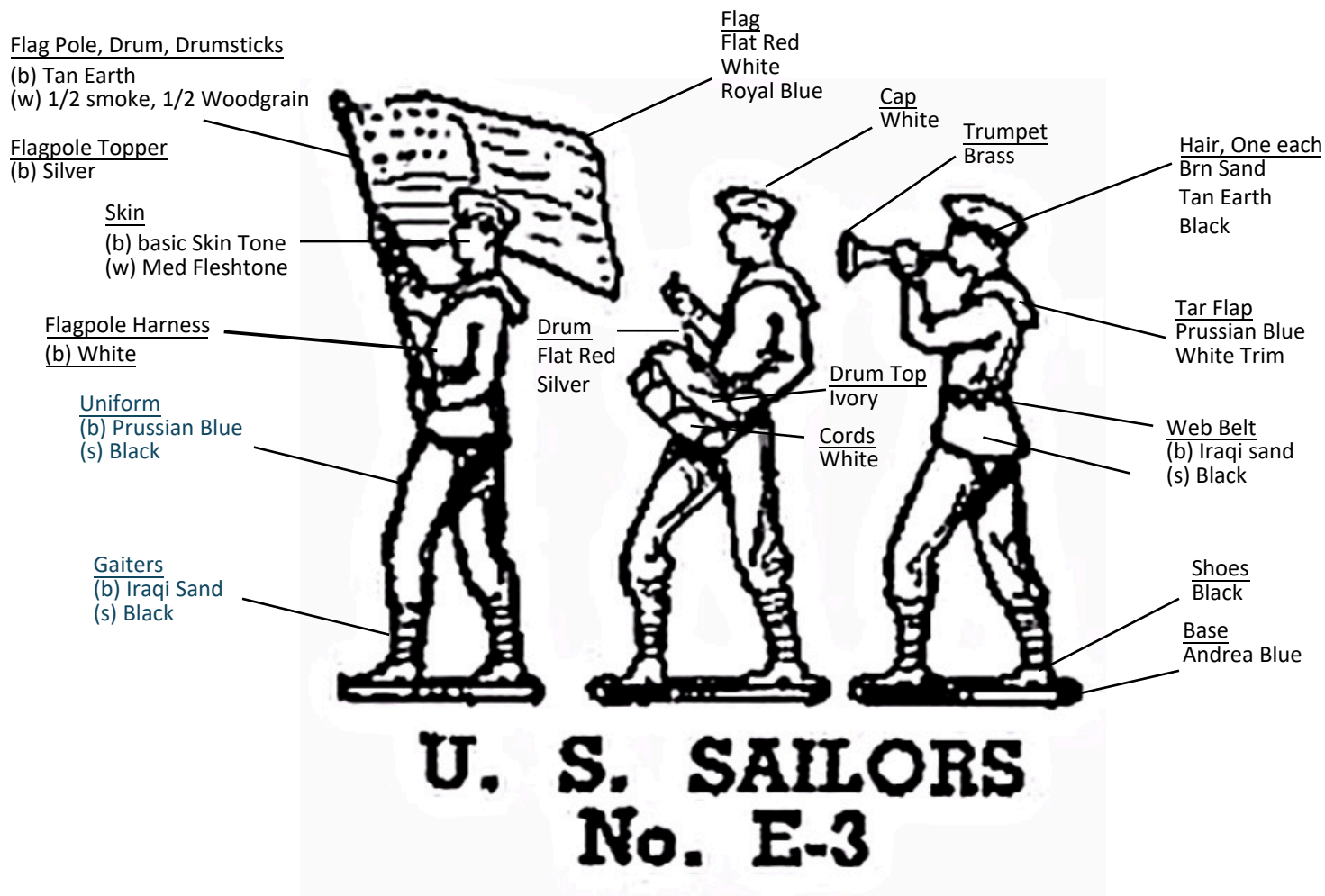


# Vintage Toy Soldier Paint Scheme for U.S. Sailors

Below are the suggested colors to paint the U.S. Sailors from the 1930's Rapaport Junior Castor mould E-3. The suggested paints are from Vallejo Paints

<i>Flat Red – 70.957</i>	<i>Black – 70.861/Silver – 70.997</i>	<i>Smoke Ink – 70.939</i>
<i>White – 70.951</i>	<i>Ivory – 70.918</i>	<i>Mahogany ink – 70.828</i>
<i>Royal Blue – 70.809</i>	<i>Brown Sand – 70.876</i>	<i>Iraqi Sand – 70.819</i>
<i>Tan Earth – 70.874</i>	<i>Basic Skin Tone – 70.815</i>	<i>Brass – 70.174</i>
<i>Prussian Blue – 70.965</i>	<i>Medium Fleshtone – 70.860</i>	<i>Andrea Blue – 70.841</i>

*You can use the brush on primer (70.601) if the model is not already primed when you received it. I STRONGLY encourage you to varnish your model when you are done painting it. The paint will last considerably longer and stay a bit more color true (in my opinion) if you do. I really like the Polyurethane Gloss Varnish 26.650 from Vallejo over their other offerings.*

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
